#### Overview:

This lecture gives a broad context for the 12th century Abbess Polymaths with a focus on Hildegard, Héloïse, and Herrad. Scientia is defined and scholarly opportunities for women are discussed including the reasons why women sought sanctuary in abbeys. The views of the cosmos and man as microcosm are compared between Hildegard and Herrad (*Scivias, Liber Divinorum Operum, Hortus Deliciarum*) before focusing in on Hildegard's medicinal and natural history works (*Causae et Curae, Physica*) which combine a theological and humoral framework. Finally, a commonality of the women scholars mentioned is a legacy of challenges to authorship.
